Dr. Jean-luc Doumont, the Nature Series Editor and Lead Author of *English Communication for Scientists*, is an engineer from the Louvain School of Engineering and a Ph.D. in applied physics from Stanford University. A world-acclaimed expert on scientific communication, Jean-luc has 20 years of experience running lectures and workshops on writing scientific papers, giving oral presentations, graphing data, and related topics in English, French, Dutch, and Spanish. His audiences include graduate students, postdocs, and faculty at top-notch universities around the world (including MIT, Stanford, UC Berkeley, Caltech, and Harvard), scientists at public research centers (such as NIST, CDC, VIB, ICFO) and at private R&D centers (such as HHMI, Shell, Johnson & Johnson), attendees at international conferences (such as those of SPIE and IEEE), and many more. Jean-luc is a founding partner at Principiae, a lecturer with SPIE and OSA, and the author of *Trees, maps, and theorems*, a book on "effective communication for rational minds."
